



Articulation Agreement between TRINITY BIBLE COLLEGE AND GRADUATE SCHOOL (TBCGS) and the SCHOOL OF LEADERSHIP (SOL)

TBCGS has evaluated the offerings of SOL for the purposes of determining an articulation path for SOL graduates who wish to further their studies at TBCGS.

Candidates who complete the *Advanced Leadership Certificate (ALC)* at *academic level* will receive 12-transfer credits for matriculating into the *Master of Arts in Missional Leadership (MAML)* program provided they score at least an overall 2.7 GPA.¹

If a candidate completes the ALC at *academic level*, but does not score an overall 2.7 GPA, they can still apply to study the MAML without receiving transfer credit.

If a candidate does not have an accredited Bachelor's Degree, but does have an ALC at *academic level*, they can apply to study the MAML using TBCGS "Alternative Pathway" program. This option requires that a candidate have a minimum of five years of ministry experience. TBCGS Admissions Committee may use any of the following to evaluate a potential student's eligibility for the Alternative Pathway program:

- Level of Ministerial Credentials;
- Portfolio of Ministry Experience;
- Current Level of Ministry Involvement;
- Recommendations by ministry leaders familiar with their work;
- Interview with a member of the Admissions Committee or Graduate School faculty member; and
- Sample paper to demonstrate academic ability.

SOL will make use of certain academic guidelines utilized by TBCGS such as referencing styles and grading scales to promote a seamless transition for SOL students entering the MAML.

SOL shall list TBCGS on its website together with a summary of this articulation agreement of transfer credit.
